Refunds	This is amounts spent in the prior budget refunded to the Area in the current budget
In-Kind Donations	This is the amount a member spends on a budgeted item but for which the member does not seek reimbursement. The expense is recorded in the appropriate budget line.
Area Delegate	Most service positions include an amount for attendance at assembly (food, hotel) plus an amount for administrative costs, travel to assemblies and other Area meetings. The Area Delegate budget includes that amount plus an amount to cover additional expenses at Conference and the cost of attending the Northeast Regional Delegates (NERD) meeting each spring. In the Delegate's first year, the budget also includes an amount for the outgoing Delegate to attend NERD with the incoming Delegate, which will be in the 2026 Budget.
Room Rental	These funds are used to pay the rent for rooms for the AWSC meeting in February, September and November, Spring Assembly, Delegates Report Assembly and downpayments for Fall Assembly locations.
Round-Up Event Costs	These are the actual costs involved in attending the Round-up: hotel, food, travel and some literature for public outreach.
One Day Assembly	Maine policy recognizes that some one-day assemblies are far enough away from some assembly members that an overnight stay is essential and warranted. Those members can apply for reimbursement from this line account should that be the case. (i.e. Spring Assembly in the Bangor area is over three hours' drive for those coming from the south)
Our Fair Share	The equalized expense for the Delegate to attend the World Service Conference in April. This expense is calculated by World Service so each area pays an equal amount. (See Service Manual for more detailed information) The payment is due in the Fall for the following year. An Area can pay just the Equalized Amount or any amount above that. (See Service Manual for how WSO calculates the amount.)
Ample Reserve	Following a multi-year process of figuring out how to arrive at an Ample Reserve number for the Maine Area, that amount was developed at the 2022 Fall Assembly. The \$5,450 is designed to cover 'Essential Services' as described in Warranty One in the event of a severe financial downturn. Those Essential Services include: Our Fair Share, AIS Phone, Website/Technology Costs, Roundup Chair attendance at Roundup, Membership Outreach, some Public Outreach and a provision for a one-day Assembly. This number could be changed by vote each year, if necessary, to reflect changes in costs. It is calculate and voted upon at Fall Assembly.
Incorporation Expense	The Area World Service Committee voted to incorporate the Committee to protect those serving from using their personal information that might be needed to perform their service job. There is an annual reporting fee.
How to Read this Report	This report compares 2024's budget to 2025's budget and also compares 2024's actual expenses and income to 2025's actual expenses and income. Early in the year there are more donations than there are expenses. Most expenses come in the fall, for Fall Assembly and Our Fair Share. Look to line 38 of the last column. If it is a positive number, then income is greater than expenses. If it is a negative number, expenses are greater than income. The Reserve is shown on line 41. We started the year with more than \$8,000, over and above the Ample Reserve, shown as 'Operating Cash'. If donations are more than expenses, we don't need that \$8,000 . In 2024 the Assembly voted to spend some of that excess Reserve on Technology equipment. Group and district contributions fell short of expectations. The Convention has been such a success, its excess covers shortfalls in the Area Budget, which is not the primary purpose of the Convention.
Operating Cash	The Operating Cash for the Beginning of the year represents the excess amount over and above the Ample Reserve. Some was spent in 2024 on Technology; the Assembly could decide to reduce it further.
